SENIOR SECONDARY PATHWAYS REFORM

New VCE Vocational Major and Vic Pathways Certificate will replace the Victorian Certificate of Applied Learning (VCAL)

\$277.5 m

Good news for youth in Tarneit with more choices when finishing secondary school, including:

- ✓ \$120.2m - For schools to provide the new VCE Vocational Major and Victorian Pathways Certificate and core offering of VET subjects.
- ✓ \$87.9m - To boost the vocational and applied learning workforce.
- ✓ \$69.4m - To expand the Head Start program, giving all government school students access to school-based apprenticeship or traineeships while completing Year 11 & 12.

Two years of kinder for every child will give our kids the best start in life with the Government investing nearly \$5 billion to roll out universal three-year-old kinder! This is fantastic news for young families in Tarneit.

This means many new and expanded centres being built across Wyndham, including a new early learning centre built alongside every new public school.

Every child starting three-year-old kinder also receives a kinder kit with education items like books and games.

Recruiting More Teachers \$779 million



Tarneit schools will benefit from the Government recruiting more than 1,900 new teachers.

Weekly face-to-face teaching hours will also be reduced by one hour in 2023, then a further half-hour in 2024 for each teacher – without reducing students' one-on-one attention at school.

That means more time for each teacher to prepare and focus on each student and their needs.

Free TAFE - Get New Skills For In Demand Jobs!

Over 100,000 Victorians have already signed up to get new skills through the Free TAFE program since it was introduced in 2019 - and has since expanded with even more funding.

Some of the most popular courses include Nursing, Accounting and Bookkeeping, Cyber Security, and Early Childhood Education - with dozens more available in a range of fields. There are so many opportunities for Tarneit residents, so check them out.

PANDEMIC REPAIR PLAN

The COVID health pandemic has placed unprecedented pressure on our health system, which is why the Budget includes a \$12 billion boost as part of the Pandemic Repair Plan. This means more staff, better hospitals, and first-class care that puts patients and families in Tarneit first.

Werribee Mercy Hospital Emergency Department Expansion: \$109.6m

Construct and fit out an expanded emergency department.

Increased Hospital Capacity: \$54.9m

Establishment and staffing of modular units to alleviate demand on ED's by providing triage, assessment, respiratory clinic, and urgent care clinic functions at Werribee Mercy Hospital, Northern Hospital and Casey Hospital.

Increased ESTA Call-taking and Dispatch Capacity: \$333m

Adding nearly 400 new staff to increase Triple Zero call taking and dispatch capacity for Triple Zero services, including ambulances, and training more operators to allocate calls across the State.

Boost to Paramedics and Ambulances: \$124m

Build on Ambulance Victoria's record recruitment levels to put 90 additional paramedics on the road - on top of the 2000 paramedics that have joined the workforce.

Better at Home Program Expansion: \$698m

Expanding the Program to help more than 15,000 Victorians access home-based care each year, in addition to telehealth check-ups. So those in need can get access to top quality doctors and nurses from the comfort of their home.

Covid Catch-Up Plan: \$1.5 billion

Increase surgical activity by providing 40,000 extra surgeries in the next year - reducing wait-lists and building up to a record 240,000 surgeries annually in 2024.

Also includes establishment of Rapid Access Hubs - fit-for-purpose theatres designed to separate surgery that can be performed quickly, from emergency and acute surgery - including at Werribee Mercy.

Growing Suburbs Fund

The Growing Suburbs Fund is about fast-tracked delivery of important infrastructure in growing communities like ours, and has just received another \$50 million in the Budget.

Wyndham Vale Line - Longer Trains



One AM and two PM peak weekday services running on the Wyndham Vale Line will be extended from 6 to 9 carriages - increasing capacity on each train by 50%.

Services include:

- ✓ 4:55PM departure from Southern Cross.
- ✓ 6:34PM departure from Southern Cross.



Derrimut Rd - Hopkins Rd/Boundary Rd Intersection Signalisation



Thanks to the \$125.7m Metropolitan Road Upgrades Program, \$18.6m is going towards improving safety and reducing delays at the intersection of Derrimut Road – Hopkins Road / Boundary Road in Tarneit. Permanent traffic signals will be installed.

"This project will go a long way in addressing safety and congestion issues on this section of Derrimut Road – while also supporting the significant population growth occurring in our developing suburbs."

GO WEST FESTIVALS FUND - \$2.4 million

Melbourne's West will host signature events supported by the new Go West Festivals Fund, including from the Melbourne International Comedy Festival, RISING and Melbourne Fringe.



The Fund will harness the creativity of our diverse communities showcasing their incredible local talent and culture, while encouraging major events to stage shows and commission new works in the area.

TARNEIT COMMUNITY AND PERFORMING ARTS CENTRE - \$500,000

Planning funding for a performing arts centre in Tarneit North, which will provide a range of community services and flexible spaces to nurture creative talent in the West.

Solar Homes Boost: \$47.20 million

• Solar Panel (PV) Rebates • Solar Hot Water Rebates • Batteries

Average annual energy bill savings could be up to \$1290 when Solar Panels are combined with Solar Hot Water.

A boost to the Solar Homes Program means there are now 64,000 \$1,400 solar PV rebates, 1,700 extra battery storage rebates, and interest free loans available in 2022/23 to support Victorian Households.

Eligible households can now also receive both a solar PV rebate and a solar hot water rebate.

If you have already claimed a rebate for panels or hot water, you can now claim a rebate for the other.
